BY ROAD:

From the Venice motorway toll booth continue along the ring road as far as the exit "Castellana". Follow the signs for "Ospedale dell'Angelo". Upon entering the hospital area, turn right for the **Rama pavilion** (green colour); the **Diagnosis and Consultancy** facility is to be found on the ground floor.

NEW VISION

Diagnosis and Consultancy Service Veneto Eye Bank Foundation

New Vision is a service for persons with eye diseases. It provides skills acquired by the Foundation working together with ophthalmologists.

It is **authorised** to function as a Specialist Outpatient Health Facility with Licence (class and code B5) issued by the Municipality of Venice.

It is officially accredited in accordance with Veneto Regional Law LRV 22/2002.

It applies a well-organised **UNI EN ISO 9001:2015** quality management system certified by Certiquality (No. 11122).

It works with the Specialty Unit of Ophthalmology of the Local Health Authority (Ulss 3 Serenissima) in respect of the study and care of rare diseases for the groups of pathologies affecting the visual apparatus.

PROCEDURE

1. RECEPTION

This is the first contact between Foundation staff and the patient, who is listened to attentively with an empathetic approach.

2. MEETING THE DOCTOR

This includes direct observation of the patient by Foundation or external specialists. The clinical stage ends with an explanation of the test results and consignment of a report.

3. ASSISTANCE

After the first meeting, there is an ongoing relationship between patient and Foundation specialists, who are all set to help in the continuity of care and support given to the person.

SERVICES PROVIDED

Comprehensive Ophthalmology Assessment

- Eye examination
- Examination of the anterior segment, refraction, prescription of lenses and prisms
- Examination of the fundus oculi
- Orthoptic assessment
- Diagnostic procedures on the ocular surface (cytological and microbiological assessment)
- Study of suitability for contact lenses
- Reports for medical use in law

- Confocal and specular microscopy
- Optical Coherence tomography (OCT)
- Corneal topography

WHAT IS THE FOUNDATION

It is a non-profit organisation of social utility. **Veneto and Friuli Venezia Giulia Regional Reference Centre for cornea transplants and Regional Research Centre on epithelial stem cells.** It was established in 1987 and is the most important structure in Italy for promoting cornea donation, the collection, selection and distribution of ocular tissues for transplants, as well as the distribution of corneal epithelial stem cells for treating severe eye pathologies. It also carries out activities of diagnosis and care.

MISSION

- ➊ To improve the quality of life of those suffering from eye diseases, working to help restore sight and assisting those who fear they will lose it.
- ➋ To ensure that cornea donation is the result of a free, fully informed decision that can also bring comfort.
- ➌ To improve the possibilities of curing diseases of the visual apparatus through ethically responsible research.

ACTIVITIES

- **Assistance, diagnosis and research** of new treatments for patients with eye diseases.
- **Research on stem cells** to find new clinical applications for adult stem cells of the epithelial lining.
- **Information and communication** to promote the culture of donation.
- **Collection, selection and distribution** of ocular tissues for transplants.
- **Medical and social research** in cooperation with Universities, Eye Banks and relevant specialists.
- **Training** for healthcare operators.
